consent of the Senate thereof; and Presidente de los Estados Unidos by the President of the Mexican Republic, with the previous approbation of its General Congress: and the ratifications shall be exchanged in the City of Washington, in four months from the date of the signature hereof, or sooner if practicable.

In faith whereof, we, the respective Plenipotentiaries, have signed this Treaty of Peace, Friendship, Limits and Settlement, and have hereunto affixed our seals respectively. Done in duplicate at the city of Guadalupe Hidalgo on the second day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight.
